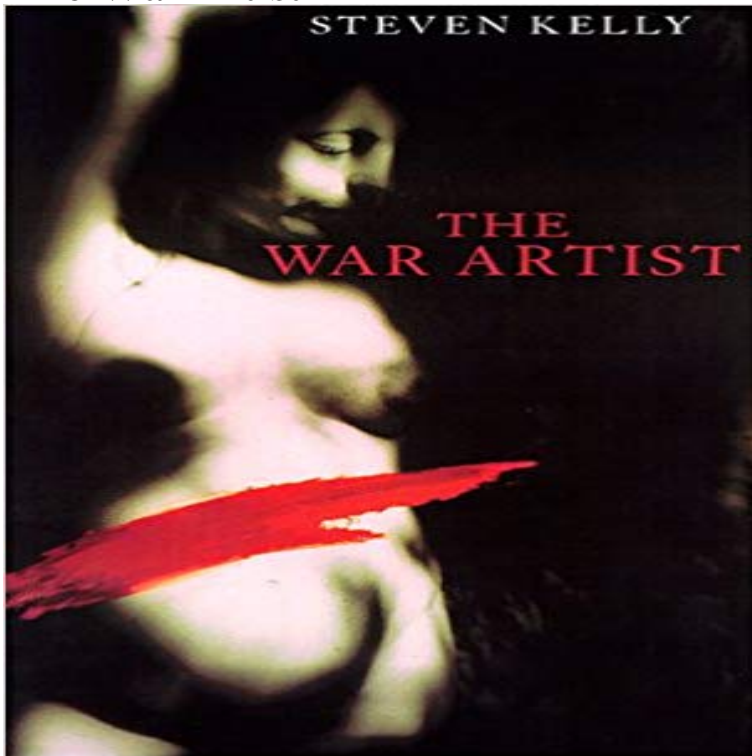


The War Artist
